Our hydrocarbon storage and distribution terminal is a state-of-the-art facility located within the WTC Industrial Park, in the heart of San Luis Potosí. This strategic location allows us to offer efficient services to the industrial corridor of central Mexico. Inaugurated in 2018, TCM became one of the first private terminals in the country, marking an important milestone in Mexico's energy industry.

The terminal is the result of a joint venture in which Grupo Valoran owns 45% of the business unit, together with Canadian Pacific Kansas City and Watco Companies, which respectively own 45% and 10% of the subsidiary.

At TCM, we are committed to operating a refined fuel storage and distribution infrastructure that not only meets the needs of our customers but also prioritizes safety and environmental care.

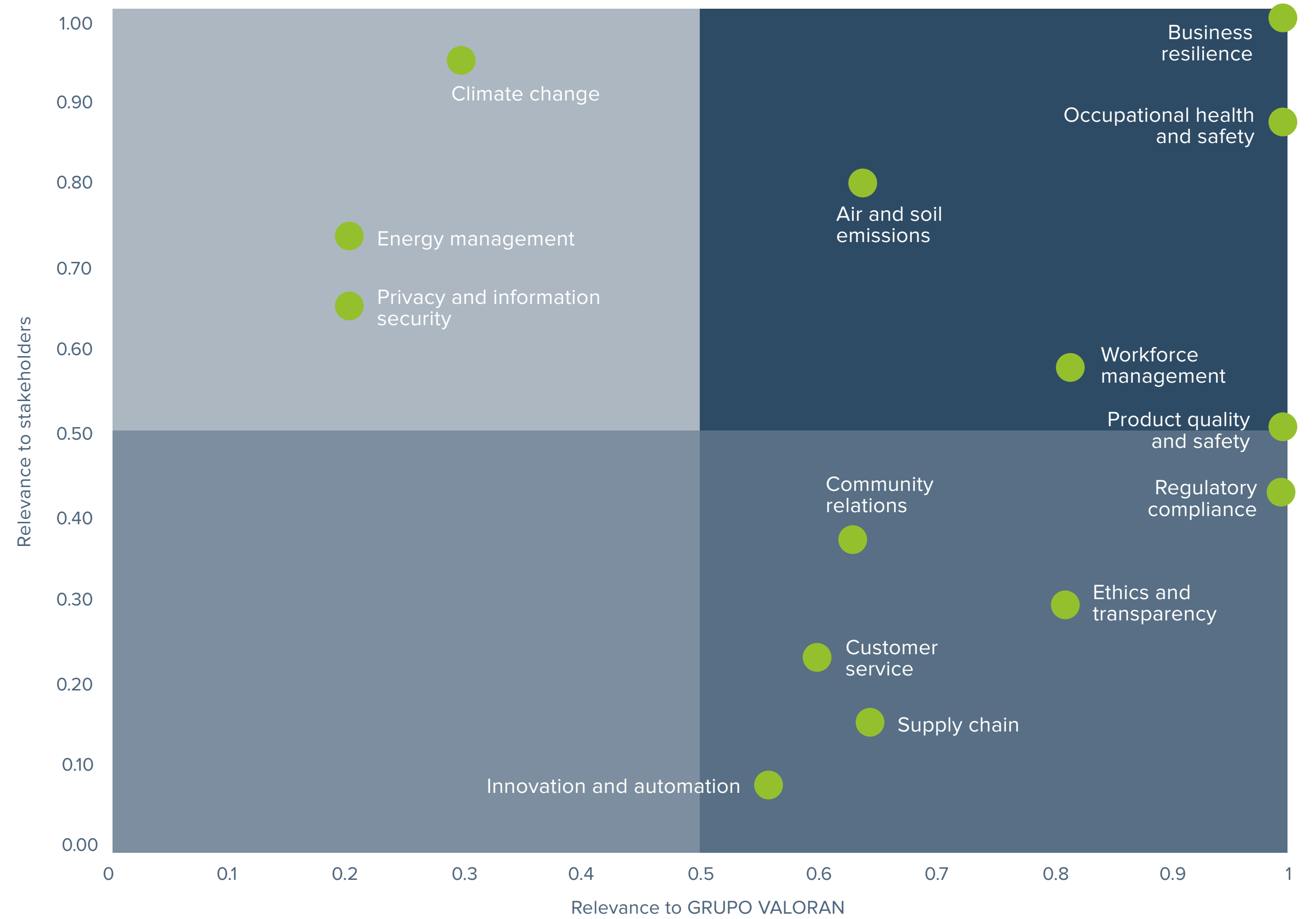

In 2024, through our annual workplace climate study, in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Labor and Social Welfare, we verified that our diesel and gasoline levels are below the exposure limits established in our operating processes.

Similarly, we made a significant investment in technology for a storage tank level automation project and the acquisition of two generators for any power supply emergencies.
